1) Does the IFCN admit that its investigation of Science Feedback was flawed? If not, how does it defend the investigation from our critique?

2) Does the IFCN stand behind (outside assessor) Michael Wagner's reasoning for dismissing complaints about PolitiFact's adherence to its policy on corrections? If so, how does it answer our overpowering criticism of that reasoning?

If the Poynter Institute continues to champion prompt corrections and transparency, those commitments are difficult to detect in its response to this situation.

Please respond in keeping with a commitment to prompt corrections and transparency.
